



IGNACIO HIERRO, UNDervalued MAN OF SCIENCE IN ZACATECAS

The contributions he made individually and collectively in the 19th century to academicize the physical, natural, medical and mineral sciences in Zacatecas are meritorious to open a place for him in the Mausoleum of Illustrious Men of the State of Zacatecas... but his *post-mortem* fate is different.

It has been of little use, or perhaps of nothing, that a street in the Historic Center of Zacatecas and another in the Electricista neighborhood of Fresnillo, as well as a secondary street in El Mineral, bear the name Doctor Ignacio Hierro.

Currently, his tomb is vandalized, desecrated and forgotten by the government authorities, despite the fact that it is located in the La Purísima Pantheon, in the state capital, decreed on November 1, 2017 as a "Funeral Monuments Zone" by the Board for the Protection and Conservation of Monuments and Typical Areas of the State of Zacatecas.

A small pink quarry mausoleum that is corroded by fungi and mold, which generate diffuse discolorations and grayish-black dots on its walls, is the only insignia that the remains of this character have received. This building was granted to him by the lodge of the Masonic rite to which he belonged.

Given

that no information source documents in depth who Ignacio Hierro Salgado was and what his contributions were in Zacatecas, an investigation of its own must be initiated, which includes going through government and public libraries, interviewing academics and Freemasons and, finally, research on the Internet... results may cause surprise.

According to an article by Adrián González Salinas on the genealogy of this character, published in the January-March 2015 edition of *La Gaceta LVO*, of the Numismatic Society of Zacatecas, in his baptism certificate dated March 13, 1833, issued in the church of La Santa Veracruz in Mexico City, it is established that it was registered under the name of José Ygnacio Gregorio Margarito Luiz Agustín Guadalupe de la Santísima Trinidad Hierro Salgado.

Three books of biographies of illustrious people from Zacatecas from the State Chronicle library coincide in the credentials with which Ignacio Hierro arrived in Zacatecas from Mexico City: mining engineer, professor of medicine, pharmacist and metal assayer, as well as a member of the National College of Engineers.

He arrived to work as a professor at the Practical School of Mines and Metallurgy, opened in Fresnillo in 1852, today the Ágora José González Echeverría Museum. In El Mineral he opened the apothecary called La Caja.

Ignacio Hierro was director of the Zacatecas Mint from 1864 to 1878, located on the street in the Historic Center that today bears his name and currently houses the Zacatecas Museum. He perfected the industrialization of silver, a fact that earned him being sent to Paris to bring cutting-edge machinery to improve the production of



money.

Adrián González's research refers that coins of the old colonial system, such as reals and shields, bear his initials: YH (Ygnacio Hierro), and cents and pesos, only the initial of his paternal surname: H.

Two researchers from Zacatecas in History have studied this character in his role as director of the Institute of Sciences, an organization that is the antecedent of the School of Human Medicine of the Autonomous University of Zacatecas (UAZ).



In two investigations with different lines of study, José Froylán Casas Flores and Hesby Martínez Díaz agree on the collective impulse that Ignacio Hierro Salgado gave to the formation of the scientific cabinets of physics, chemistry, natural history, medicine and mineralogy.

In his investigation, José Froylán Casas highlights a speech given by Dr. Hierro on January 19, 1867, when the Institute of Sciences was reopened after it was vacated by the troop of Gallic soldiers who lived in Zacatecas on the occasion of the second intervention French military.


In it he criticized the behavior of the hosts, who destroyed part of the facilities of the building they occupied; he also predicted the beginning of a new stage in the state and in the country, with the new impetus that education and scientific research would receive, comments the academic.

Hesby Martínez refers that he was a correspondent partner of the newspaper *La Naturaleza of the Mexican Society of Natural History*, between 1869 and 1870.

Ignacio Hierro Salgado lived for more than 40 years in Zacatecas. He died of an organic lesion of the heart on February 26, 1900, just when he had just been reappointed director of the Institute of Sciences.

In the center of a quad-perimeter by old quarry rectangular prism, meters high.

The sides of the mausoleum and its back have a headband bordered by 13 golden five-pointed stars, a common symbol of Freemasonry.

In its front part, from the edge of the perimeter to the door of the mausoleum, it has a ladder with three steps, which, according to the book *Masonic Symbolism*, by Jules Boucher, represent the three qualities that a Mason must acquire to obtain the light of truth: strength, beauty and candor.

Above the door there are figures in relief, among which a triangular-shaped Master Mason's hat stands out, which, in turn, is the base of an inverted equilateral triangle. Both figures also form an hourglass. In these triangles the Greek letters alpha and omega are carved... This set of symbols also has its explanation in Freemasonry.



On the east and of the upper in-triangle there is a wings, which, to Jules Boucher, Ignacio Hierro was a 33rd de-mason, the high-ancient and ac-Scottish Rite.

The upper part of the mausoleum has marble walls. On its front side the insignia "FAMILIA YGNACIO HIERRO MDCCCLXXXVI" can be read.

When consulting this last information with a freemason who ceased to be affiliated with a lodge, also called a dream mason, who requested anonymity, he reported that the date in Roman numerals of 1886 could be due to the year in which he was initiated as a member of his maternal lodge, hence the word "FAMILY".



In abandonment

In the tomb of Ignacio Hierro, carelessness, abandonment and disinterest of the government authorities and the Maximum House of Studies, as well as the Masonic lodges, can also be ob-served.

Grass grows on the roof of the mauso- leum. The iron door of this one has been graffitied and its plate was ex- pired; in the place where this one went there is a small battered hole through which a piece of wire hangs.

Day and night it remains half open, so inside it can be seen that there is a floor less than 2.5 meters; in this one


there are eight niches distributed in a quadrant. Only one is occupied, Dr. Hierro's.

Inside there is also a dunhill with diverse garbage. Among the objects identifiable to the naked eye are a white bra, a bottle of draft beer, a bottle of dark beer, broken glass bottles of soft drinks, plastic bottles of mineralized water, soft drinks and juices, a soccer ball punched out, sportswear and denim.

In addition, pieces of the marble facade of Ignacio Hierro's tombstone can be seen, among which the number 1900 (which alludes to his date of death) can be distinguished.

Undervalued contributions

The doctor in History José Froylán Casas considers that, in accordance with the *Law to honor the memory of illustrious persons of the State of Zacatecas*, in force since May 28, 1978, Ignacio Hierro meets the profile to be vindicated and that his remains are deposited in the Mausoleum of Illustrious Persons of Zacatecas.

Based on this legislation, he commented, the character meets criteria 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7, which establish as a profile standing out in public administration, in scientific research and doing extraordinary acts for the good of the State.

For the researcher, who addressed aspects of this man of science in his doctoral thesis, perhaps two factors did not work in Ignacio Hierro's favor to bring him to a *post-mortem examination*: the first, that his work was carried out during the presidential administration of Porfirio Díaz, whom the first post-revolutionary governments tried to forget.

The second factor is that science and its contributions have been devalued by governments, by politicians "and by people in power," he explained.

The truth is that, despite his contributions in the dissemination and promotion of the physical, natural, medical and mineral sciences in the 19th century, his name only stands out due to the inscription of his name on two streets and a secondary street, and he does not appear next to Francisco García Salinas, Genaro Codina, Enrique Estrada, J. Jesús Aréchiga, Luis Moya or Manuel Caloca, among other illustrious characters.
