


(THANKS AL).

Greetings Brethren,

Freemasonry for Wives, Family, and Others

from The Educator

When it comes to attracting men to join Freemasonry, a large factor in the potential candidates' decision process will very often be the attitude of his wife. Immediately, his wife will think "what's this all about"?

<u>So, what is Freemasonry all about?</u> Freemasonry is a moral and ethical education society, and a universal brotherhood, affectionately known to its members as "The Craft." Its primary aim is to teach morality and ethics to its members.

Freemasonry acknowledges the cultural beliefs of all men and excludes no man from membership, on the basis of race, religion, or politics. In this sense, it is a liberal organization, recognizing the value of all men who share a belief in a supreme being, the goal of self-improvement, and who work towards the betterment of mankind.

Three great principles that are cornerstone of the beliefs of Freemasonry are taught in Lodges throughout the world. These are Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth. Freemasons are expected to practice these principles by:

- showing tolerance and respect for the other's opinions and behaving with kindness and understanding to all people.
- Practicing charity and care for their own and for the community by charitable giving and voluntary work.

Striving for the achievement of the highest ethical and moral behavior and spiritual truth

So, where does Freemasonry come from? The beginnings of the Craft are some-what obscure, but there are a number of theories as to its origin. Organized Freemasonry began in 1717, when four lodges meeting in London, England combined to form the first Grand Lodge. When, and under what circumstances, these four original lodges were founded is not known. The most prevalent theory is that Masonic Lodges, as we know them today, emerged during the Middle Ages, and that they are somehow descended from the operative lodges of stonemasons.

During the Middle Ages, a number of trade professions existed, with members of each usually grouped together in guilds (or, what today we would call, trade unions). One of these was that of the stonemason, whose guilds were known as "lodges." However, unlike town-based guilds (as most of them were), the stonemason profession was itinerant (or, mobile). When one building site was finished, the stonemasons had to physically move to another location to continue their employment. They often were housed under one roof at the building site – the probable origin of the word "lodge."

Apprentices to the stonemason trade usually were indentured at about age twelve. Typically, an apprenticeship lasted seven years. Not only were apprentices trained in building in stone, but the lodges also acted as more general educational institutions, teaching religion and morality.

Simply put, people ceased building castles and cathedrals. For more information click here.

Freemasonry has many unexplained mysteries in its ritual, one of which is the reference to the "Holy Saints John." It comes in the monitorial lecture of the Entered Apprentice degree. Candidates are told that Masonic lodges are dedicated to Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the Evangelist. Together, they represent the patron saints of Freemasonry.

To this day, Masons all around the world continue to recognize these two figures as the patron saints of Freemasonry. In fact, the closest thing we have to a Masonic holiday is the feast days of the two saints. St. John the Baptist's feast day is celebrated in the summer (June 24), and St. John the Evangelist's is in winter (December 27). Masons and Masonic lodges mark these days with their celebratory dinners or other events. They are two of the most important dates on the fraternal calendar.

The reasons for this connection went back in centuries and remained hidden in mystery. What we knew for certain was that it was not strange that there would be a Patron Saint of Freemasonry.


During the Middle Ages in England and Scotland, many societies and guilds were dedicated to a particular saint. That figure received special devotion from the members of the society, and, in turn, he would offer its members special protection and favor.





Men - A Freemason who has a wife, girlfriend, significant other or partner who needs answers about the fraternity which you have been uncomfortable or unsure if you could answer her questions and still keep your promise of secrecy.

Women - If the man in your life is a Freemason or he has voiced an interest in joining the fraternity, you deserve a much better answer to your questions than "It's a secret! I promised not to tell."

Ex-Wife - Anyone who is curious about an ex-wife's role within Free-masonry in the United States.

Anyone (male or female) who is curious to know what questions women ask about Freemasonry.

In other countries, which are under different Masonic jurisdictions, there may be variations in protocols, rituals, symbols, symbol meanings and secrecy levels but, the intrinsic foundation (the basic precepts of Freemasonry) remain the same.

Freemasonry in the United States is based upon the 2B1Ask1 system, whereupon a man must request to join the fraternity of his own free will.

In many other countries, men must be invited to become a member.

As your Grand Lecturer, I am excited to announce that in 2023 we will again hold a Ritual Competition recognizing the importance of ritual excellence within our Jurisdiction. As we all know, the manner in which we perform our ritual can either motivate or discourage future enlightenment for both the candidate and the Lodge. To this end, we must all strive to demonstrate the best ritual possible. It is our hope that all our members will elect to participate in this exciting competition and demonstrate their commitment to raising the standard of ritual excellence in our Craft.

This year there will be a competition for Master Masons; for the INDIVIDUAL or TEAM to deliver the Candidate Proficiency Work in all three degrees.

During the 2023 Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of California, the Grand Master, the Executive Committee, and the Ritual Committee wish to recognize the individual or team that best exemplifies the involved work.

To participate in the competition, the individual or team must complete and submit the attached Registration Form to their District Inspector (or, in his absence, their Division's Assistant Grand Lecturer) by the deadline of <u>APRIL 1, 2023</u>. The Inspector will work with everyone to identify a suitable date, time and location to exemplify the work, after which he will forward the winning individual's registration form to his Assistant Grand Lecturer (AGL) by <u>JUNE 1, 2023</u>. The AGL will then work with the district winners to identify a suitable date, time and location for the Division competition where the best individual will be identified. The AGL will then forward the winning individual's registration from to the Grand Lecturer by <u>SEPTEMBER 1, 2023</u>. The Grand Lecturer will invite the division winners with the four (4) highest division scores to attend the final competition in Fresno on Saturday, <u>September 30thy, 2023</u>. The winner of the final competition will be identified by the Grand Lecturer at the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge. All division winners will be recognized by the Grand Master at Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge which will take place October 27-29th, 2023.

The winner of this competition will receive the title of "Best Ritualist 2023" for the involved work. Each individual or team division winner is encouraged to attend Grand Lodge, at their own expense. Awards not presented at Grand Lodge will be presented later by their respective Assistant Grand Lecturers.

Monsta Snow Selected as Menifee's June Business Spotlight

Local boba and Taiwanese snow eatery offers delicious treats and a welcoming environment for those with similar interests in Asian culture, while also supporting Menifee's youth.

MENIFEE, CA - The City of Menifee is thrilled to announce "Monsta Snow" as the June Business Spotlight, a program that is a part of the Economic Development Department's B3 (Building Better Businesses) program. Monsta Snow is a family-owned boba tea and dessert shop. Owners Brian and Laura Spencer opened its flagship location in Murrieta in 2017. In 2022, they opened their second location, "Monsta Snow too," to bring their love of boba tea and Asian desserts to their hometown of Menifee. Monsta Snow offers cold brew tea, milk tea, freshly made boba soaked in brown sugar and honey, as well as a variety of creamy and milky-flavored Taiwanese snow (similar to ice cream, but lighter). Monsta Snow also offers a bubble waffle, which is a popular egg waffle street snack that can be found throughout Hong Kong. They use this as a base for the Taiwanese snow, almost like a waffle cone. Additionally, they serve savory eats such as fries, cheese curd, lumpia, crispy tofu, and much more. Laura Spencer, like many after college, was not certain of what her future entailed and began working at a boba shop. Ten years later, after starting a family and moving to Menifee, Laura still felt a strong connection to working in the boba industry. The calling to share the Asian culture and its delectable desserts with their beloved community became evident to her, and Menifee presented a wonderful opportunity to fulfill this passion. Monsta Snow's sweetness extends further through their support of the younger generation, and they have also created a space for those with interests in Asian culture. Monsta Snow has hosted multiple school and club fundraisers, donated rewards for students and school programs, as well as supported local sports programs. The business has also hosted multiple events including K-pop (Korean Pop Music) cup sleeve events and anime/car meets. "Monsta Snow has been a valuable addition to our city. They have created a place for those with similar interests, allowing them to form a tight-knit community," said District 2 Councilmember Ricky Estrada. COMMUNITY & FAMILY EARTHQUAKE SAFETY GUIDE

HOW TO PREPARE YOUR FAMILY FOR EARTHQUAKE?

- 1. Check the location of your house if along or near an active fault, prone to landslide, liquefaction and tsunami.
- 2. Assess your house using the "How Safe is my House?" tool for self-check for earthquake safety.
- 3. Orient family members About earthquake and its hazards.
- Teach each member on what to do before, during and After an earthquake e.g during earthquake "DUCK (DROP), COVER, and HOLD.
- **5.** Conduct observation on safe and unsafe spots in your house. Have your family member identify each.
- 6. Prepare family emergency supply kit.
- 7. 7. Prepare family evaluation procedure.
- 8. 8. Familiarized your family with the community earthquake evacuation plan. Walk-through the evacuation route going to

- the designated evacuation area (Open space).
- **9.** Know the community emergency contact numbers and facilities Such as police and fire stations, hospitals, schools, hall, etc.
- **10.** Regularly conduct earthquake drill with your family and other household members. Actively participate during community-wide drill.
- 11. Teach your family basic first aid, how to use fire extinguisher, switching off waterlines, gas tanks, and circuit breaker.
- **12.** Agree on how to reunite with family members and plan to communicate:
 - Have an agreed meeting place.
 - Designate a friend or relative outside your area to be contacted
 - If you have children, inquire with the school administrators about their school policies during earthquakes.
 - Know where the school-designated evacuation areas Potentially the most valuable takeaway here is knowing how to talk to others about your stress.
 This goes both ways, as you need to know how to discuss your problems with others as well as talk to anyone that comes to you with their issues.






