and friends what we're all about.


September will also host several FUN events in the 826th Masonic District, 2 events are scheduled for Saturday

Greetings Brethren,

The Principal Tenets of Freemasonry:

Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth

I want to share a series of three Masonic Notes that will remind us the core reasons why we became members of this fraternity. I hope this will help us all to remember those reasons and strengthen our commitment to our fraternity. These notes are based on a brief lecture provided to the brethren to remind them that, at their core, they are Master Masons. However, it is good for all of us, regardless of our Mason affiliations, to remember why we chose this path in the first place.

The Three Principal Tenets of Freemasonry are Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. This article will focus on LOVE.

Brotherly LOVE is one of the closest bonds that can exist between individuals. If we are to practice brotherly love, we must be willing to look previous differences or trivial criticisms AND always attempting to see the good that exists in brothers or, for that fact, other individuals in general. Welcome! August is a busy month for me. First of all, at the Stated Meeting I will be presenting to the lodge its mid-year financial and membership standings as well as any other information for the benefits of Masonry.

Secondly, this month is the per capita payments to the Grand Lodge of California. Menifee Valley Lodge No. 289 was randomly selected to submit remission audit for this masonic year that involve other committee to provide reports and minutes. By the way, for brethren's special awareness on the information to be presented at August Stated Meeting concerning the semi-annual financial and membership reports, those were outlined in the California Masonic Code (CMC section 805.220D and 805.230B).

The per capita invoice will be discussed to our Lodge then we will submit payment as requested. California Masonic Code Section 809.520 provided that the Lodge can pay its per capita (which is the money due to Grand Lodge of California) without consent of the Lodge because payment must be received before the start of the Annual Communication in October. If payment is not received on time, then Lodge will not be eligible to receive voting representation during the sessions and the Lodge name will be recorded in the minutes of the Annual Communication 2022 for not paying the 2022 per capita. Therefore, this month is dedicated to complete the financial process in a timely manner.

On another note, just so everyone knows, we still have some members not paid their dues so if you happened to know these members, please talk to them so that I can continue to process dues payments as they come and record in iMember 2.0 then provide their dues cards if requested

For any dues remissions questions or concerns, the member can contact myself or forward the information directly to the Charity Committee.

What Is A Masonic Trestle Board?

A Masonic trestle board is a design board for the Master Workman (Architect) to draw his plans and designs upon to give the workmen an outline of the work to be performed. In today's terms, we might call it a blueprint.

It is one of the 3 Movable jewels.

A trestle board is a framework consisting of (usually 3) vertical, slanted supports (or legs) with one or more horizontal crosspieces on which to hang or display an item. Today, it is better known as an "easel".

Some jurisdictions around the world call it a tracing board. It would be somewhat of a "circular logic" task to argue the difference, as, while neither can be fully proven (in historical writings), the "Tracing board" may very well have preceded (come before) the use of the word "Trestleboard" because lodges in Europe (which pre-date American lodges), use the word "Tracing Board".

Hiram's Tracing Board

Hiram Abif's tracing board is believed to have been made of wood, covered with a coating of wax. Each day he would draw his Master architect's measurements and symbols into the wax in order to instruct his Master Masons of the work that was to be accomplished.

At the end of the day, he would simply scrape off the wax and pour a new layer of hot wax onto the board to ready it for the next day's work.

Masonic Tracing Board

Much later, in the days where lodge was held in secret areas and on hills and vales, (valleys) once lodge was in session, the Tiler (or Tyler) would draw an oblong (rectangular) or oblong square depiction (image) into the dirt that represented the form of the lodge.

Again, onto that tracing board was drawn the architect's plan...the working tools in the degree that was to be worked.

Masonic Trestle Board

Through the years, the Masonic Tracing Board progressed to charcoal or chalk on the floor of taverns where lodges were held back in the 1700s. After the lecture, the Stewards or the Entered Apprentice, as a lesson in secrecy, would get a mop and bucket and remove all trace of these drawings.

This, obviously, was a somewhat tedious and messy procedure, so cloths or rugs were created which could be laid onto the floor and simply folded up when the lecture was complete.

Later, these cloths (or rugs) were placed onto a table. As time passed, they were finally hung onto an easel...(a trestle board) much like a drawing board at a construction site where each workman could receive clear instruction as to what his specific participation entailed.

When the team's work was completed, it was obvious that each Master Mason not only understood their specific part in the undertaking, but how their part (no matter how small), contributed to the construction of the entire edifice (building).

The meaning of the words "Nothing further remains to be done, according to ancient custom, except to disarrange our emblems" is a reference to the now antiquated use of these Trestleboard (or tracing boards) during which the dirt on the ground was erased or the chalk marks on the floor of these lodges was mopped or scrubbed, to leave no trace of the form of the Lodge or the contents drawn thereon

The reason why our lines of travel are at right angles within the lodge and thus the reason that we "square" the lodge is a "throwback" to the antiquity of the ritual.

If the brethren were to walk atop the markings made in the dirt on hill and vale; atop the chalk on the floor of the taverns; or tread upon and thus soil the cloths or rugs used to provide the workings of that degree, the message of that lecture which was being worked could be partially or fully destroyed.

Therefore, "Squaring the Lodge" in a semi-military-like precision, goes back many centuries as the means of preserving the ritual and the degrees being worked so as not to destroy the symbolism of their markings before their usefulness on that day has been completed.

How old is the use of Tracing Boards?

Masonic scholars note its similarities to today's Freemasonry trestle boards.

Many modern-day lodges now simply use a emailed newsletter to notify the brethren of a degree which will be worked.

Burton Lee French is Born

Today in Masonic History Burton Lee French is born in 1875.

Burton Lee French was an American politician.

French was born in Carroll County, Indiana on August 1st, 1875. For the first few years of his life his family moved around the western part of the country. At the age of five they moved to Kearney, Nebraska. Two years later they moved to Princeton, Idaho after a short stay in San Francisco, California. A year after they moved to Palouse, Washington. During this time, French was attending public schools and graduated in 1891. Two years later, in 1893, he entered the University of Idaho at Moscow. He interrupted his studies to teach school in Kendrick and Juliaetta, Idaho.



In 1898, French was elected to the Idaho State Legislature. It was during this time he returned to school and graduated from the University of Idaho in 1901. From 1901 to 1903 he was a fellow at the University of Chicago in political science and studied law. In 1902, he left the Idaho State Legislature. He was admitted to the Bar in 1903 and began practicing law in Idaho.

It was also in 1902, at the age of 27, French was elected to the United States House of Representatives. He served in the House until 1933, although what seat in the House he held changed over the years. When French first entered Congress, Idaho had only one at large district. In 1911 a second at large district was added. By 1919, there were Congressional districts in Idaho and French was elected to serve from the 1st Congressional District.

French passed away on September 12th, 1954.

French was a member of Kendrick Lodge No. 26 in Kendrick, Idaho. In 1909 he demitted from the lodge to affiliate with Paradise Lodge No. 17 in Moscow, Idaho. He was a member of Paradise Lodge until the time of passing.




The Masonic Monthly Poem


